Connecting your Mouse


Once you have unpacked your mouse, connect it to a free USB port on your ${\sf PC}$ as shown.

Button Functions


See the table below for quick reference to the available functions for each button.

Buttons 1-5	Left Click: Performs the standard single click when pressed
	Right Click: Opens the menu when pressed.
	Universal Scrolling: Activates the universal scrolling function when the button is pressed.
	Double-Click : Performs a double click action when pressed.
	Keystroke/Macros : Performs a customised advanced function. See the online help file for more details.
	Windows Button 4: Emulates the function of Windows Button 4 when pressed.
	Windows Button 5: Emulates the function of Windows Button 5 when pressed.
	Switch Profile: Switches to one of the five customizable profiles when pressed. See the online help file for more details.
	Button Off: The button is de-activated.
Buttons 6 & 7 (Moving the scroll wheel backwards or forwards)	Scroll Up: Scrolls up the page when pressed.
	Scroll Down: Scrolls down the page when pressed.
	Keystroke/Macros : Performs a pre-defined advanced function. See the online help file for more details.
	Right Click: Opens the menu when pressed.
	Button Off: The button is de-activated.

Customising your Mouse

Your mouse features five buttons, each of which can be assigned a specific function to best suit your needs. Once the software is successfully installed, click the mouse icon in the system tray to open the main screen .



1	Select a function for each mouse button from the drop-down menus.
2	Select the polling rate from the drop-down menu.
3	Select the mouse DPI drop-down menu.
4	Drag the slider to select the double-click speed.
5	Test the double-click speed here.
6	Click to have your changes take effect without closing the screen.
7	Click to cancel any changes you have made.
8	Click to save your settings and close the screen.
9	Drag the slider to select the mouse sensitivity.
10	Click to save or load profile settings.
11,	Click to select one of five possible profiles.

Using the DPI Button

You can use the DPI button on the top of the mouse to switch to a different DPI quickly and easily. When you press the button, the LED will light. Repeated presses light more LEDs. The more LEDs lit, the higher the DPI setting.
